Alumnus Aaron Dostie: Seminarian

Ithough electronic communication is off limits for first-year seminarians, we have heard from HCA 2015 graduate Aaron Dostie in the form of a handwritten letter. He entered Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, NE, in September.

As he begins his preparation to become a priest in the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, he says his life is very busy and quite different. Their days begin before 6:00am when the seminarians chant Lauds. They also chant the other hours of the day finishing with Compline at 7:30pm. Then they observe Grand Silence without speaking until after breakfast of the next day. They attend classes and do manual labor throughout the day, but it's not all work. They also have times of recreation when they play sports and converse with each other. He says already he feels a sense of brotherhood with his fellow seminarians and everyone has been welcoming and helpful.

Spiritual Message - Fr. Joseph F. Kehoe


t the present time there is an excellent Catholic catechism course available from the following source entitled, "Eternal Life 2015 Catalog". Today I would like to share with you the structure of this home study course. It consists of three points: The Revised Basic Catholic Catechism Course, the Advanced Catechism Course and the Masters Catholic Catechism Course.

In the catalog it states "The Revised Basic Catechism Course was written for the training of teachers of religion, providing them with the necessary means of sharing the Faith, teachers preparing students, parents providing the spiritual needs of their children, people helping friends and family to develop and expand their knowledge of the Faith – anyone, everyone who wants to grow in their knowledge of the Faith and strengthen their ability to share it with others will benefit from the Catechism Course."

There are three basic books in this first course, namely the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* approved by Pope St. John Paul II, the *Modern Catholic Dictionary* by Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J. and The Father John A. Hardon, S.J., *Basic Catholic Catechism Course* -- Revised and Updated Under the Direction of Raymond Leo Cardinal Burke... Manual.



New Teachers Bring Talents to HCA Faculty
