

Pioneers in the Renewal of Catholic Education

The rich history of education has been a gift of the Catholic Church down through the ages. This past year, Holy Cross Academy celebrated 20 years of teaching in that same tradition, faithful to the teaching authority bestowed upon the Church by Our Lord Himself.

Holy Cross was founded in 1997 with the personal blessing of former Syracuse Bishop James Moynihan by a group of Catholic lay men and women dedicated to providing an excellent education imbued with the faith. They were pioneers in the renewal of Catholic education, becoming involved in the Catholic independent school movement which sprang from the call by the Second Vatican Council and Pope St. John Paul II that the laity use its own unique resources in taking Christ's message to the world.

The entrepreneurial spirit of Holy Cross set a course for excellence, and continues along that course today. Co-Founder and Principal Teri Maciag says that this spirit, "continues to allow it to draw from the best models of education, from the timeless and traditional to the creative and innovative, in order to carry out the mission of educating the whole person — body, mind, and spirit." It is their mission to help students on their journey to heaven.

Tethered to the Source of Truth

Co-Founder and Board of Trustees President Daniel Miller pointed out that, "Jesus Christ commissioned the Church to teach all nations, and promised to safeguard that teaching. If we remain tethered in this way to the source of all truth, there is no limit to the depth of understanding, and the height of knowledge, that is available to us. This is why the greatest advances in mathematics and science, philosophy and theology, law and jurisprudence, language and education, music, art and architecture historically have sprung forth from the inquisitive minds of Catholics. Truth really does set us free!"

However, truth is fiercely under attack today, Miller warned. "Especially the unchangeable teachings of the Catholic Church about life, marriage, and family. Holy Cross steadfastly counters the opinions voiced by many in the media, entertainment, government, and even many academic and religious entities, which attempt to draw our youth to a false understanding of life." The school is dedicated to upholding and transmitting Church teachings, and leading students to virtue and true happiness.

The junior-senior high school is registered with the NYS Education Department, and successful students earn diplomas from both New York State and Holy Cross Academy. The Academy's independence allows it to design its own curriculum, and they have opted not to offer the Common Core. They believe that this gives teachers the freedom to tailor the classes to the needs of their particular students and focus on what is most important.

Catholic Identity Enlightens Curriculum and Culture

The 1977 Vatican document *The Catholic School*, described the task of a Catholic school as "a synthesis of culture and faith, and a synthesis of faith and life. The first is reached by integrating all the different aspects of human knowledge through the subjects taught, in the light of the Gospel; the second in the growth of the virtues characteristic of a Christian."

Holy Cross Academy is committed to this integration and to employing qualified teachers, trained in their specific disciplines, who are mindful that Catholic identity should be evident not only in religion classes, but also in every academic, arts, physical education, and technology class. This identity enlightens the curriculum and culture of the academy, permeates the classes and activities throughout the day, and inspires the school's presence in the wider community.

Genuine Caring, Friendship, and Charity

Students from twelve area school districts attend HCA. Teachers help them strive for excellence according to their own individual abilities by drawing out those abilities to their fullest measure. In an atmosphere of genuine caring, friendship, and charity, the faculty and staff form a partnership with parents, the primary educators of their children. The strength of this school-home linkage is a vital element in the achievement of HCA's educational goals.

Amy Collins, a teacher at Holy Cross and an HCA alumna, noted that, "Any school can simply teach facts and pass along information, but to instill in students a sense of joy and wonder, to encourage them to be

virtuous and mentor them by good example, and to transmit the truths of the faith to the next generation, this is what Catholic education is all about. This is what Holy Cross Academy is all about."

After celebrating this milestone and giving thanks for the many accomplishments along the way, Holy Cross looks forward to the next 20 years and beyond with joy, hope and confidence.

The school is dedicated to upholding and transmitting Church teachings, and leading students to virtue and true happiness.

n May 31, 2018, Holy Cross Academy marked the conclusion of its 20th year with a wonderful celebration, thanking God, and honoring many supporters, especially those from the early years. It was an evening



Holy Cross hosted 90 year old Holocaust survivor Magda Brown, who spoke to the students, staff and guests about her experience during WWII as a Jewish prisoner in Hungary and then later Auschwitz Concentration Camp. Students, led by Claire Breckenridge, began raising money in the fall to fly Brown from Chicago to N.Y.

Though Magda lost much of her family, she has been dedicated to peace and sharing her story of hope. She was moved by HCA students, especially Claire, "I'm very proud of her," Brown said. "This is where my faith is and my hope is. A future with smart people of good thinking, doing the right thing."

Fr. Joseph Kehoe - Active in Retirement

Reverend Joseph Kehoe celebrated 50 years since his ordination to the priesthood in May, and has recently entered retired life. Father Kehoe was ordained in the Cathedral of Syracuse on May 21st, 1966. He graduated from St. John the Baptist High School in Syracuse, received a bachelor of business administration from LeMoyne College and a certificate from Glastonbury Monastery Latin School in Hingham, MA, before entering Christ the King Seminary at St. Bonaventure. He also was a professed Third Order Franciscan.


Fr. Kehoe served three years with the Air National Guard, and was assistant pastor of Holy Family, Fulton; St. Vincent de Paul, Syracuse; St. Lucy's, Syracuse; Immaculate Conception, Fulton; Sacred Heart, Cicero, and St. Mary's in Baldwinsville. He served as administrator of St. Mary's of Irish Ridge, and at Holy Cross in New London, which he provided as the first home of Holy Cross Academy in 1997.


For 29 years, he served as Pastor at Saint Francis Church in Durhamville, NY, and also at Saint Therese Church in Munnsville. Through the years Father Kehoe taught religious education to youth and adults,

served patients in the Oneida Healthcare facilities, and was chaplain to the Knights of Columbus. For the last twenty years, since the founding of the school, Father Kehoe has been a spiritual advisor to Holy Cross Academy. He is well known for his smile, good sense of humor, and his unwavering commitment to the Catholic faith. Fr. Kehoe was awarded "The Cyrenian" at the 20th Anniversary Dinner for his work in advancing and sustaining the mission of Holy Cross Academy. Father Kehoe now resides at the Nottingham in Syracuse, but he can still be seen at Holy Cross events, and will continue to be featured in future publications of Holy Cross News.
